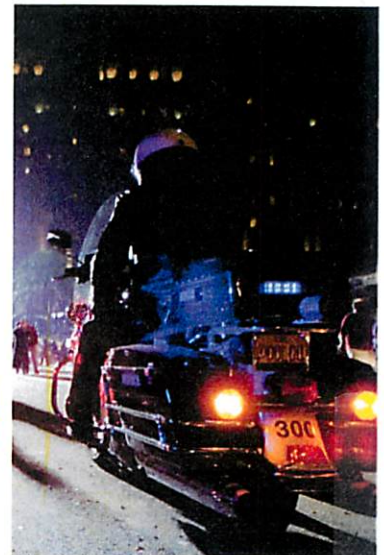


22nd ANNUAL Problem-Oriented Policing Conference
